Introduction to Nose Work is presented by two instructors featuring one of the Founders and/or NACSW Faculty. Introduction to Nose Work covers the foundation for a successful start in K9 Nose Work®. This workshop is required prior to participation in any future workshops. The workshop includes a power point presentation that reviews the history, elements of the sport, description of introductory classes and video of dogs as they progress from their first class through competition. The remainder of the workshop takes dogs through the basics of an introductory nose work class. The learning process and progression the dogs take lays the groundwork for successful introduction of odor and other elements in follow up workshops.
